FUNDING OPPORTUNITY FOR UNC FACULTY 2023-2024 GALAPAGOS SEED GRANT PROGRAM

<u>PURPOSE</u>: These awards are designed to foster the development of research partnerships and projects in the Galapagos Islands of Ecuador, with a focus on the Galapagos Science Center, a jointly developed and supported facility of UNC-Chapel Hill and the Universidad San Francisco de Quito. Grants are to UNC faculty to undertake preliminary and/or exploratory research. *Preference will be given to applications from junior faculty and for new project initiatives*. We are seeking applications from across the university. The Galapagos Initiative emphasizes the study of the social, terrestrial, and marine sub-systems in the Galapagos Islands of Ecuador and their integration through a focus on population, health, and environment.

SPONSORS: The Ron Rindfuss & Steve Walsh Junior Faculty Galapagos Travel Grant, the UNC Office of Research Development, and the UNC Center for Galapagos Studies.

<u>AWARD DETAILS</u>: Faculty may apply individually, together with a UNC student, or with other faculty members from different disciplines. Approximately 3-4 grants will be made this year in amounts up to \$5,000 for a single UNC applicant or \$7,500 for UNC co-applicants. Awarded funds will be available for use beginning January 1, 2024, and they must be expended during the 2024 calendar year.

ELIGIBILITY: Full-time faculty from all units at UNC are eligible to apply for funding. Adjunct faculty, post-docs, and staff are not eligible for this opportunity. Interested degree-seeking students of any level must be teamed with a faculty member who meets the eligibility requirements.

<u>APPLICATION PROCESS</u>: The project proposal is limited to 3-pages, single-spaced, 12-point font, 0.75-inch margins, and includes the following:

- Project title, research problem & question, and general research plan.
- A clear statement of the applicability of the project to the Galapagos Islands & related Island Ecosystems.
- Applicant's current academic position and background relevant to the proposal research.
- Expected benefits to the UNC Galapagos Initiative & description of plans for external grant submissions.
- Budget, justification, timeline (all projects are limited to 12 months); 1-page bio-sketch (extra page).
- Please note that funded seed projects requiring Galapagos National Park permitting (not all do) must plan to prepare their Park permit application immediately upon receipt of the notice of award.
